PRECONDITIONS FOR THE APPROVAL OF SUBJECT MATTER PROGRAM IN LATIN
Summary of Subject Matter Preparation Program
Department of Classics, San Francisco State University

The Subject Matter Preparation for the Single Subject Teaching Credential in Latin shall include (a) 34 semester units of core course work in Latin language and literature and Roman culture, covering the linguistic skills, cultural and literary knowledge commonly taught in California Secondary Public Schools, and (b) a minimum of 6 semester units of course work that provides breadth and perspective to supplement the essential core of the program. The program totals 40 units. All courses in Latin, Classics and Classical Archaeology are taught under the direction of the Classics Department. The introductory linguistics course is taught under the direction of the Department of English Language and Literature, and the courses in the Roman Republic and Imperial Rome are taught under the direction of the Department of History. **Students who expect to receive a recommendation for subject matter certification must achieve a grade “B” or better in each course.** The program is as follows (all course numbers refer to current courses offered at San Francisco State University; equivalent courses, including paired graduate courses prefixed by 7--, may be credited upon appropriate request and review by the Department of Classics):

*Students may use as elective courses any civilization and culture course not used as a required course and any other upper division course in Latin literature or language development. In addition, students may use 3 units of approved Special Study in Latin which provides depth in a specific area, such as advanced composition, historical linguistics, comparative grammar, Latin syntax, and literary genre studies.
